ACCOLADE™ elm

The ACCOLADE™ elm is a Chicagoland Grows® selection that demonstrates very good resistance to Dutch elm disease (DED), and elm leaf beetle. It is useful as a street, parkway, or shade tree. This elm has glossy green leaves and yellow fall color.

Botanical name: Ulmus davidiana var. japonica 'Morton'



Prefers a moist, well-drained soil.

Do not prune elm trees between mid-April and mid-October.

Disease, pests, and problems

European elm flea weevil is a minor problem.

Wetwood can occur.

Disease, pest, and problem resistance

Very good resistant to <u>Dutch elm disease</u>, elm yellows and <u>elm leaf beetle</u>.

Native geographic location and habitat

Of hybrid origin.

Bark color and texture

Bark is gray, ridged and furrowed.

Leaf or needle arrangement, size, shape, and texture

Alternate leaves with toothed edges; shiny dark green in summer.

Fall color is yellow.

Flower arrangement, shape, and size

Flowers are green and inconspicuous, appearing in early spring.

Fruit, cone, nut, and seed descriptions

Seeds enclosed in a flat, circular wing.
